Kudos for students:

- We have a new group of middle school students here for the second quarter from three of our sending schools.
- Our Culinary Arts students under the supervision of Chef Tim prepared a wonderful meal for our annual Program Advisory Dinner on October 23rd; over 50 businesses and industries were represented.
- Our General Trades and Culinary Arts students prepared a spectacular array of food for our annual Open House. Students were demonstrating their skills and instructors were showcasing programs throughout the evening to a very large crowd of parents and other visitors in spite of the stormy weather.
- Jean Palmer and Jason Darling took the Multimedia Communications class to Boston on November 14 as a part of the MELMAC grant to see the Boston Museum of Arts, see a play, tour Boston on foot, and "look at the world through a different lens". Students boarded the Amtrak at 7 a.m. and returned back in Brunswick at 3 a.m.
- Students in Building Trades have made 45 raffle ticket stands for the Festival of Trees fundraiser happening for the next two weekends in Brunswick. Lowe's donated all of the materials, and Joanne McMahon made red sleeves to slide on the stands.
